ADPARE'S MISSION

is to provide alternative reintegration services for young people at risk.

In 2022, ADPARE exclusively carried out activities specific to the fight against human trafficking; mainly victim protection and assistance activities, but also research, training and prevention activities. In 2022, through the implemented projects, we worked to maintain and improve the ACASA program – specialized protection and assistance program for victims of human trafficking.

ACASA programme

Specialized protection and assistance program for victims of human trafficking

Specialized protection and assistance services for victims of human trafficking are permanent and have been granted in collaboration with relevant institutions, NGOs and international organizations in the field.

Protection and support services are approached in a flexible manner, adapted to the needs of the beneficiaries, the working method being case management, to focus on the resources of the beneficiaries, their motivation for change and their initiatives, to increase the level of adaptation of the person to the requirements of independent living.

This process varies from person to person as needs are different, but an assistance program can last anywhere from 1 to 3 years.

The services offered under the protection and assistance program (crisis, medium or long duration) were carried out:

- in the family of origin or extended family of the victims;
- at the ADPARE counseling center - here the victims participated in individual, group and family counseling and individual therapy; educational and recreational activities;
- in the residential system/regime - in transit and long-term, in the protected apartment of ADPARE.



Protection and assistance services intended for victims of trafficking in minors were granted exclusively with the participation of guardians, both family members and representatives of social assistance and child protection services.

The integrated provision of assistance and protection services this year also included the provision of services for victims' dependents (underage dependent children), as well as for parents/support persons/guardians, in the case of minor victims.

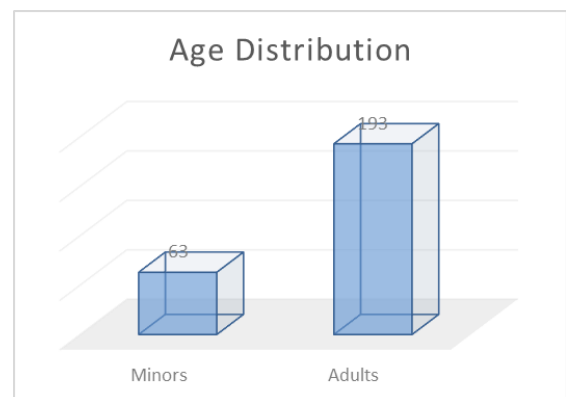
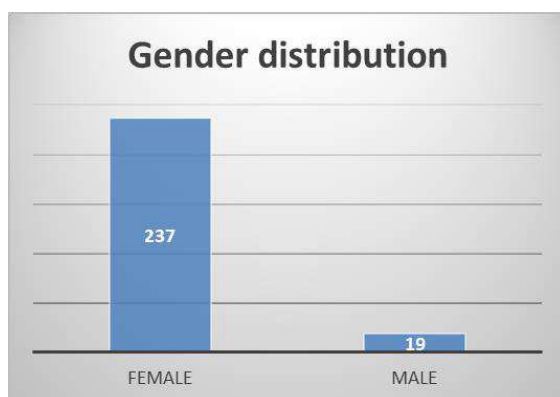
The purpose of the protection and assistance program for victims of human trafficking is to generate a comprehensive and flexible mechanism to assist victims of human trafficking, regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, religious affiliation and socio-economic status, to overcome vulnerability and build coping skills. independent living by providing integrated support services and partnership.

In 2022, the number of refferals was the highest since the beginning of the association's activity and ADPARE had to expand collaborations and partnerships; thus, in 2022, ADPARE reached a number of 17 lawyers, collaborators at the national level, 8 psychotherapists and 4 clinical psychologist experts.

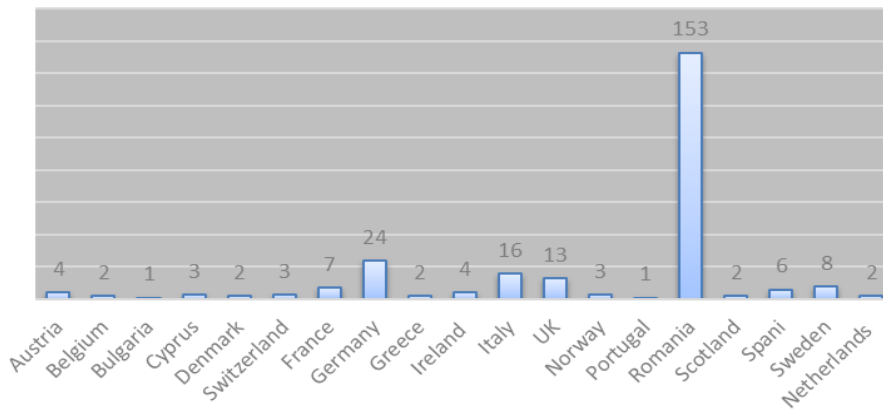


Characteristics of assisted victims in 2022

In the ACASA programme, in 2022 ADPARE assisted a number of 256 victims of human trafficking. 146 victims were referred in 2022 and 110 victims were assisted but referred in previous years.

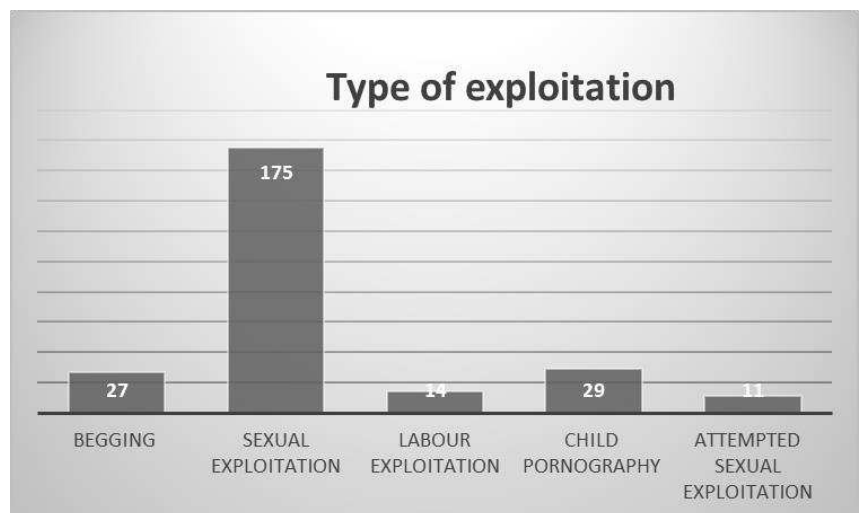


Destination countries



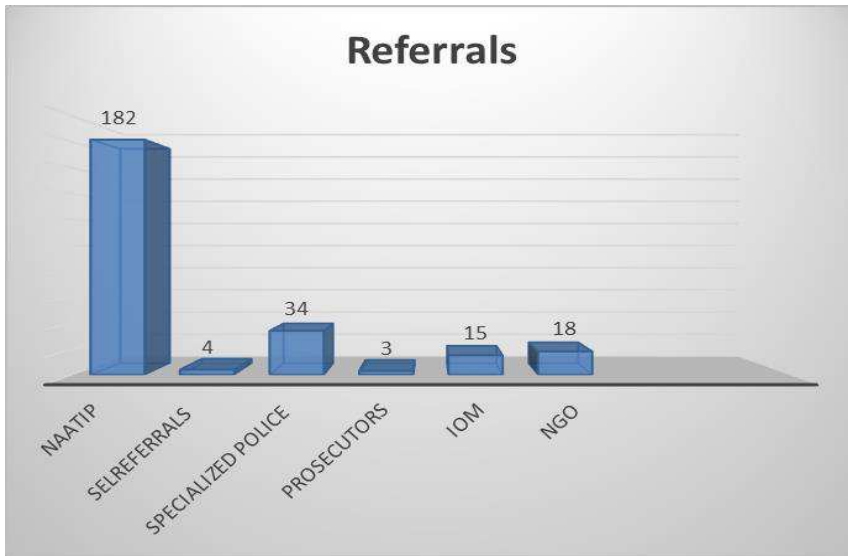
Of the total number of victims, 22 were exploited in more than 1 country.

Type of exploitation

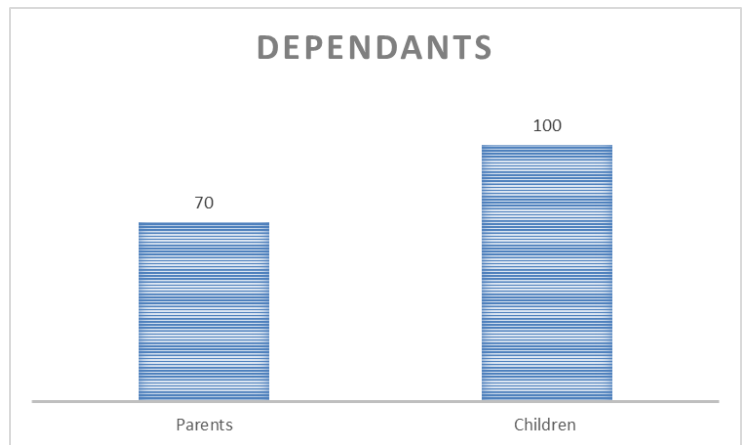


Out of 175 victims, 5 suffered several types of exploitation.
